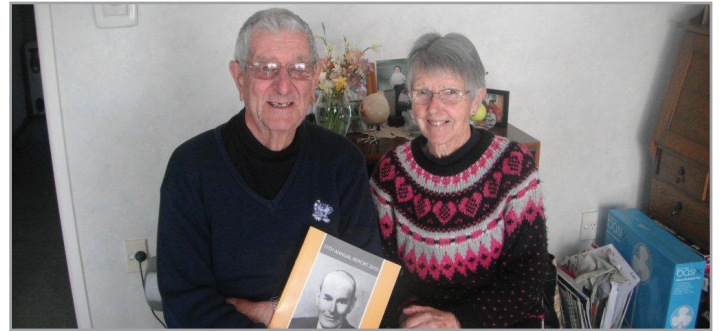

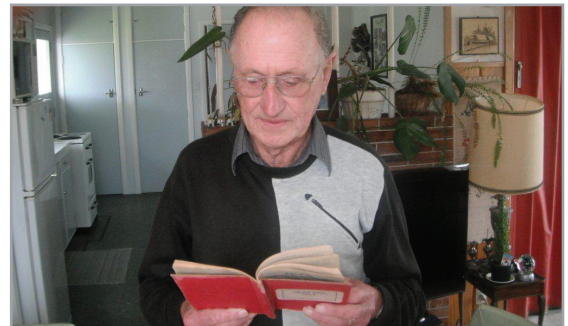
THREE MORE LUCKY PRIZES
